Message from SAM Gwen Arneson

"Reminders & Interruptions"

If you're like me, you rely on reminders in your life! Trustworthy people, entries on the calendar, notes on counters, emails to ourselves, post-it notes stuck to mirrors and doors – are all helpful in remembering what we are to do and where we are to be, especially with life's predictable interruptions!

As followers of Jesus, we need frequent reminders...and interruptions, too.

The story is told of a pastor baptizing a two year old a few years ago. Just as the baptism concluded with the words, "Child of God, you have been sealed with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ forever," the toddler said, "Uh-oh!" To be baptized is to become vulnerable in a special way and to assume a calling that makes us all, at one time or another, say, "Uh-oh! What next, Lord?"

Author Ronald Rolheiser, in his book, <u>The Holy Longing</u> wrote, "Baptism is a submitting to love, and to let one's life be forever interrupted. To not let one's life be interrupted is to say no to God's love."

Our daily lives and routines, I believe, beg to be interrupted in holy and meaningful ways. Some of the important ways we intentionally allow interruptions to take place, are to gather to worship and be fed in the holy meal. When we come together as community, we're reminded time and time again that it is through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus that our lives find meaning and purpose. It is when we remember our calling to love and serve God and neighbor, and remember that we're all equal at the foot of the cross, no exceptions.

I need consistent reminders, day after day, week after week, year after year, of the important relationship God has with me, and the relationship I have with my siblings in faith, even if I've not yet met them. Maybe you need the same reminders. There are days when I crave a holy interruption for my soul to be fed in order to carry on and be who I believe God has created me to be.

I need to worship. I need to hear God's word proclaimed in the singing, in the sermon, and in the prayers. I need to receive the body of Christ broken and given FOR ME and receive the blood of Christ shed FOR ME. These times of worship are holy interruptions and vital to the baptismal journey.

Mid-week Lenten Services are held each Wednesday evening during Lent. There will be a Lenten Supper at 6:15 pm, followed by worship at 7:00 pm, all downstairs in the Fellowship Hall. A favorite hymn of mine in the ELW includes these words, 1) "What is this place where we are meeting? Only a house, the earth its floor. Walls and a roof sheltering people, windows for light, an open door. Yet it becomes a body that lives when we are gathered here, and know our God is near...3) And we accept bread at this table, broken and shared, a living sign. Here in this world, dying and living, we are each other's bread and wine. This is the place where we can receive what we need to increase: our justice and God's peace."

In the coming weeks we have many opportunities to set aside time for "Holy Interruptions." Deep into our Lenten season, there are two more midweek Wednesday evening services with Holden Evening Prayer. Palm/Passion Sunday on April 13 will take us from the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem to the sobering reality of the events later in the week. Maundy Thursday (April 17) and Good Friday (April 18) are important pieces of the Story (capital S intentional as we refer to God's Story of salvation). Please don't skip these services and jump from Palm Sunday to Easter. You'd miss a big chunk of the Story! And finally, we are reminded – and how we need this reminder – that the Good News we cling to and hope in is revealed to us once again in Jesus' empty tomb of Easter (April 20) morning! From death comes life; death does not get the final word!

I look forward to walking together with you as children of God, claimed in baptismal waters, living lives filled with holy interruptions and persistent reminders of God's love. I promise to remind you and ask that you remind me, as well!

The Stewardship Committee will be serving suppers during Lent. Suppers are served starting at 6:15 pm. A free will donation will go towards the narthex heater fund. Anyone willing to bring dessert for the Lenten suppers, contact Cindy Eye or Judy Enger.




